As you may be aware, Isle of Man Newspapers have recently reported that Dr Henrietta Ewart, the Director of Public Health for the Isle of Man Department of Health and Social Care, will be a keynote speaker at a forthcoming party political conference on Sunday, 20 November, 2021.

As you would appreciate, it is normal in Westminster-derived political systems for the civil service to ensure that objectivity and political impartiality are maintained in all relationships to demonstrate integrity. I understand that the Isle of Man Government's Code of Conduct for Public Servants (last updated January 2017) does not appear to specifically impose such a requirement on Isle of Man Government staff.

Consequently, could you please advise if it is common for members of the Isle of Man Public Service to support partisan political events as keynote speakers? What guidance do you provide to public servants when attending such events? Is this part of an outreach effort to other community organisations, and if so, has Dr Ewart made efforts to attend events hosted by other political parties?

4.10pm: Keiran Hannifin, who stood unsuccessfully in September's general election, will talk about this time as a political outsider.

5.40pm: Dr Henry Uniacke, who will cover zero-carbon churches.
